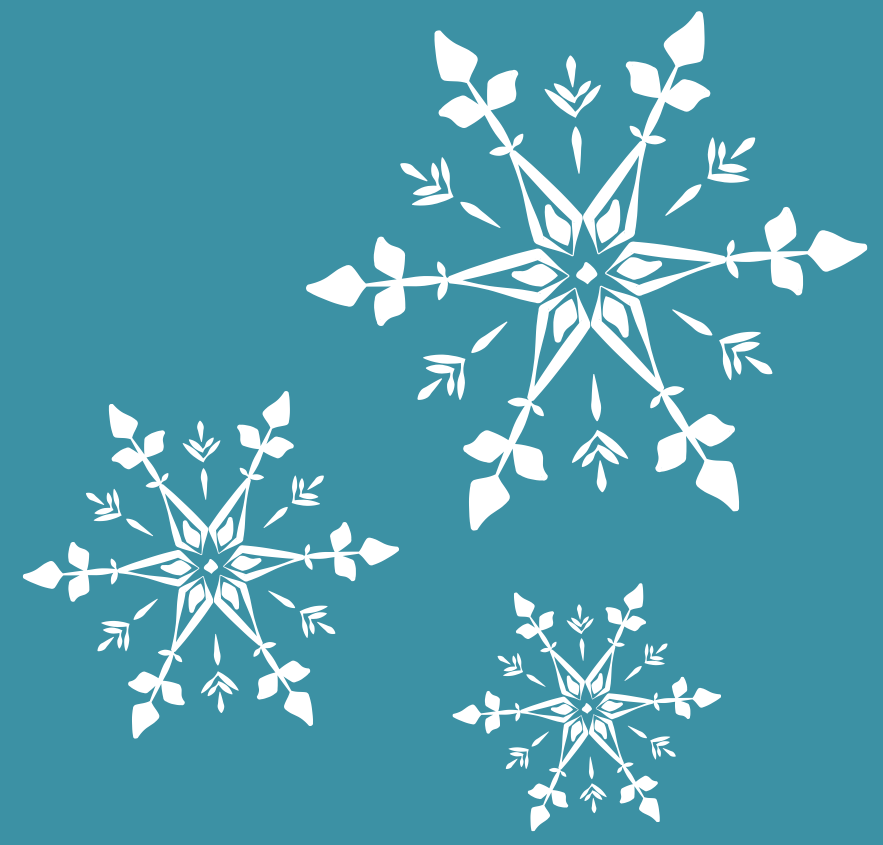

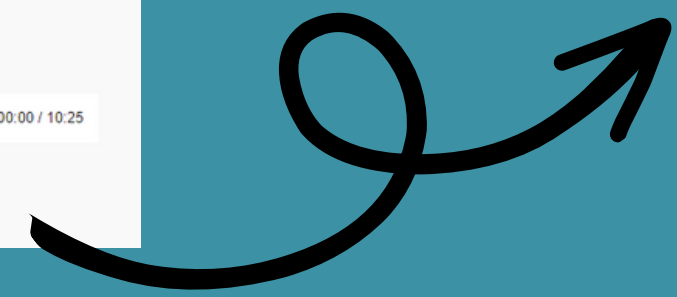


Winter was a time for storytelling. Children would sit around the warm tipi and listen to their grandparents tell beautiful legends and stories.
