The Registered Apprenticeship Program

- 1.Get a head start on a trade. Most trades are 4 years in length and 1500 hours of work each year. All of the hours the students work in high school go towards that first year and beyond.
- 2.Earn significant high school credits and earn while they learn-up to 40 credits
- 3.Build your skill set and their resumes. Even if they do not pursue the trade after high school, they develop a skill set of critical thinking, learning to work safely, following multiple instructions, developing a strong work ethic etc. that employers are looking for.
- 4.It's an opportunity to dovetail career paths and education types: for example, become an electrician (college) and an electrical engineer (university). What an excellent way of combining the practical and theoretical ways of learning.
