

Dear Members and Supporters,

I hope this message finds you well. I am writing to bring your attention to the upcoming National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a significant date in our nation's calendar. On Saturday, September 30, 2023, Canada will observe this day as a statutory holiday, dedicated to remembering and honoring the lost children and survivors of residential schools, along with their families and communities.

September 30th also holds the distinction of being Orange Shirt Day, symbolizing unity and remembrance. We encourage you to wear an orange shirt or the color orange on this day to pay tribute to the children who endured residential schools, to remember those who did not make it, and to demonstrate our commitment to reconciliation with the motto: "Every Child Matters."

At the Public School Boards' Association of Alberta (PSBAA), we firmly believe that reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples is a crucial mission. However, for reconciliation to take root, we must first confront and acknowledge the truth. That is why we emphasize the importance of understanding the profound impact of residential schools on Indigenous Peoples.

Our commitment to this cause is exemplified by the PSBAA Board of Directors and staff, who have pledged to enhance their understanding through the Indigenous Canada 12-lesson Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) offered by the Faculty of Native Studies at the University of Alberta, accessible via Coursera. This course delves into the diverse histories and contemporary perspectives of Indigenous peoples living in Canada. You can access more details about the course on the following page (3).

The PSBAA has placed truth and reconciliation at the forefront of our strategic priorities. We are dedicated to nurturing positive relationships, built upon mutual respect and goodwill, with all First Nations, Métis, and Inuit communities in Alberta.

Furthermore, we wholeheartedly endorse the implementation of all 94 Calls to Action outlined by the federal Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC). In line with this commitment, we stand by the Alberta government's dedication to infuse First Nations, Métis, and Inuit perspectives and experiences throughout the K-12 education system in Alberta.

### INDIGENOUS CANADA ONLINE COURSE

Indigenous Canada is a 12-lesson Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) from the Faculty of Native Studies at the University of Alberta that explores the different histories and contemporary perspectives of Indigenous Peoples living in Canada. From an Indigenous perspective, this course explores complex experiences Indigenous Peoples face today from a historical and critical perspective highlighting national and local Indigenoussettler relations.

Topics for the 12 lessons include the fur trade and other exchange relationships, land claims and environmental impacts, legal systems and rights, political conflicts and alliances, Indigenous political activism, and contemporary Indigenous life, art and its expressions.

Our mission in the Grande Prairie Public School Division is to be a learning community in which every student succeeds. Part of our learning involves the Board and all staff seeking to continuously improve the educational experience of students and their families. It was our focus on continuous improvement that resulted in the development of the Grande Prairie Public School Division's KinderPAL program, which was new in the 2021-2022 school year.

KinderPAL is an optional early learning program that provides full day learning for Kindergarten students. KinderPAL students experience regular kindergarten classes for half of their school day while the other half is focused on structured play and learning. KinderPAL programming supports students' development as they strengthen their foundational knowledge and skills through their play with other students. A certificated teacher provides the program design and curriculum-specific instruction and certified Early Learning Instructors deliver the early learning KinderPAL programming.

We know that students' early years create the foundation upon which their future growth and achievement will occur and are proud that our students and parents LOVE the KinderPAL program! Following the introduction of the program at select schools for the first two years, it has expanded to all 13 GPPSD schools that offer kindergarten programming and do not have a conflict with an existing program or do not have space available.

KinderPAL provides professional planning and instruction and is play-based, engaging students to explore their curiousity, work with others, develop their learner skills, and build positive attitudes about school as they Play And Learn (PAL).

### **BOARD CHAIR MESSAGE**

#### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

A Prairie Land priority has always ensured that school communities are given the opportunity to provide critical input into the education of our students. In January of 2020, the Prairie Land Board visited each of our school communities in an effort to share a possible deficit budget and the subsequent cuts that may be needed to balance the financial deficit. The feedback received was perceptive and the appreciation displayed by the communities proved the importance of the consultative processes.



As the world is now beginning to move beyond the online meeting process that has been so prevalent as of late, the Board of Trustees and the division, are planning to visit each of our school communities.

There will be a focus on specific community topics as well as divisional areas, in addition to a set amount of time devoted to the education plan and assurance

model. The board will once again be busy in January and February with these meetings, however, the information received will be invaluable and helps direct the division in a positive and progressive manner.

Prior to the COVID pandemic, the Board of Trustees were interested in connecting with municipal partners in an effort to organize a collective that would have the ability and interest in advocating on similar topics of interest. It is a common known fact that enhanced educational opportunities in rural and remote-rural Alberta involves bringing together a variety of partners and the efforts needed for this to happen at times can be difficult. With that, the Board has made the decision to meet in each of our school communities while extending an invite to each municipal partner directly linked to that community. Having learned from a fellow board (while attending a PSBAA event), the Prairie Land Board of Trustees will include local council members, mayors, or county executives in these school community tours. This practice speaks to the tenet of educating a school community to better understand the needs of the Division, which ultimately is what is in the best interest of our students and their communities.

### PROGRAMS, COURSES AND BURSARIES

### **Explore – Second Language Program**

Explore is an intensive language immersion program that provides opportunities for English-speaking students to study French, and for French-speaking students to study English.

The program has two categories one for ages 13-15 and the other for 16, 17, or 18+. For 13 to 15 year olds, three-week summer sessions are available. Some virtual Explore sessions are offered for those who are unable to participate in person. For participants 16 and older, Explore sessions are offered during the spring or summer, which last between 31 and 33 days.

The program contributes \$2,400 for each participant 13 to 15 years old and \$3,350 for each participant 16 years and older. This covers the costs of tuition, instructional materials, meals, and lodging.

Are you an educator? Counsellor in the Classroom

Help raise awareness about youth mental health and well-being by bringing Kids Help Phone's nationally funded Counsellor in the Classroom program to your school!

The Counsellor in the Classroom program promotes the discussion of mental health and well-being among young people. The program is available from coast to coast for students in Grades 6 through 12 across Canada in both English and French. This is an opportunity for educators of Grade 4-12 students to promote help-seeking and provide students with more information about mental health and the support available to them.

The program is divided into two parts, firstly the classroom is provided activities which are led by the teacher and the second allows students the opportunity to learn and engage with a Kids Help Phone professional counsellor. In this virtual session, the counsellor will share information about Kids Help Phone's services and facilitate a discussion about why it can be difficult to reach out for help sometimes, as well as answer any questions that arise

### **GRANTS**
