WEST LETHBRIDGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BOUNDARY CHANGES

We asked:

Given the data presented in the video, what concerns or challenges do you foresee with the current school boundaries?

You said:

Key themes:

- Capacity issues at schools, in particular at Coalbanks and Mike Mountain Horse.
- Continued growth on the Westside.
- The location of the Spanish bilingual program: Some comments advocated for moving the Spanish Bilingual program, others advocated for keeping the program at Coalbanks.
- Attendance boundaries that have not equalized enrolment across all schools.
- The over use of modular classrooms to address enrolment growth and capacity concerns.
- Enrolment over original capacity resulting in core spaces such as gymnasiums, learning commons, flex spaces, and gathering spaces being over crowded or not being used as intended.



We asked:

For schools that are experiencing capacity concerns, what suggestions do you have to address the challenges?

You said:

Key Themes:

- Consider moving the Spanish bilingual program including providing transportation to the new location.
- Consider grade reconfiguration on the Westside, for example K-3 structure.
- Consider redrawing boundaries for West Lethbridge elementary schools.
- Consider redrawing boundaries throughout the city to even out elementary population in schools across the Division.

We asked:

Are there specific neighbourhood community factors that should be considered in boundary adjustments?

You said:

Key themes:

- Coalbanks should serve as a community school for the community of Copperwood.
- Consider diversity of student population.
- Keep students in close proximity to schools.



We asked:

What are your ideas for minimizing disruptions to students and families during boundary changes?

You said:

Key themes:

- Transparency of proposed decisions.
- Communicating early.
- Phased implementation for changes.
- Consideration of sibling's school of attendance.
- Transportation solutions need to be considered.
- Consider feeder schools when creating new boundaries.
- Continue engaging stakeholders in the conversation throughout the process.
